



Travelling with pets abroad

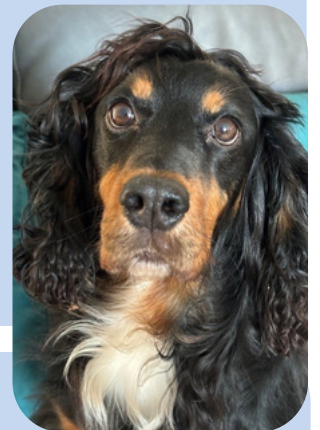

Lupoid Onychodystrophy is a rare condition that causes abnormal growth and pain in the toenails, leading to cracked or flaking nails. When first diagnosed, Digby had to have bandages on all four paws after having a lot of his nails clipped right back to the nail bed to help them grow back stronger.

Digby has been to see us every couple of weeks since then to have his nails trimmed and has been on different types of medications to help with his condition. Despite this being an uncomfortable experience for Digby, he's always wagging his tail and so well behaved!
